Important Curriculum Information

The College of Business strictly enforces all the course prerequisites for the Business Minor curriculum. In order to register for a course, you must have all the prerequisites for that course completed BEFORE the semester you take the course. No substitutions for minor courses will be accepted other than equivalent courses (refer to check sheet for a list of equivalent courses).

- 205 level courses require 30 credits completed prior to taking
- 305 level courses require 60 credits completed prior to taking

There is no limit on how many courses a student can take at another institution to count toward the Business Minor. Note that community college courses can only count toward 100-200 level courses at CSU. Students choosing to transfer Business Minor courses from other institutions must independently research potential options and equivalencies.

Business Administration Minor

What is the Business Administration Minor?

The College of Business at Colorado State University offers a Business Administration Minor which covers many aspects in the field of business, including Accounting, Finance, Marketing, and Management. The Business Administration Minor consists of 24 credits and allows students to focus in business in addition to their primary program of study. It is intended to provide students with a foundation in business administration.

Who is Eligible for the Business Administration Minor?

The Business Administration Minor is designed specifically for non-business students. Therefore, it is available to undergraduate students from any college at CSU other than the College of Business.

Admission Requirements

There are no special admission requirements for the Business Administration Minor. To declare the minor, simply attend a Business Minor Seminar. Allow 3-5 business days after the session to be able to register for business courses.
